#### Head Lice

We have had a number of head lice cases in school recently.

## How to get rid of head lice:

Treat head lice as soon as you spot them. You can treat head lice without seeing a GP. You should check everyone in the house and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day.

## Wet Combing:

Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You can buy a special finetoothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits. There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

- Wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- Apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)
- Comb the whole head of hair, from roots to ends.

Wet comb on days 1, 5, 9, and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice.
Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.

### Medicated lotions and sprays:

If wet combing has not worked or is not suitable, you could try a medicated lotion or spray. These kill head lice in all types of hair and you can buy them from pharmacies, supermarkets or online.

#### Snow and Ice procedure

We are prepared for the possibility of snow disruption during the winter and poor weather conditions. Our key objective during the worst weather conditions is to open school on a site that is safe and adequately staffed. When we experience ice or snow our first priority is to assess whether we can make the site safe enough for adults and children.

Although we keep up to date with forecasts and weather warnings, some snow and ice conditions can be quite localised. What appears to be 'slushy' snow at school can be compacted very quickly on frozen ground when children are walking on it, or there may be severe snow around school but little where you live.

When there is a possibility that school may not be able to open we will assess the following criteria:

- Can the site be made for children, parents and staff
- Will we have sufficient staff to meet safe and appropriate adult:child ratios?
  - Can we provide meals at lunchtime?
- Are external agencies e.g. police, LA, monitoring organisations advising against travel?

When we are confident we have an adequate number of staff and accessibility to school is safe, we will open.

# Where a decision to close is made, the Senior Leadership Team will ensure that as soon as practically possible:

- The decision is made as soon as possible preferably before 7:30am
  - Parents and carers are informed via a text message
    - The school website is updated
- The close information is shared with the Local Authority and radio stations

If the school is to remain closed for a second day, a decision will be made by 6pm the same day.

#### In the event of heavy snow during the school day

In extreme circumstances, when adverse weather is predicted or breaks out during the school day, a decision may be made to close the school with immediate effect. The decision to close school during a working day is not taken lightly but the overriding principle is the safety of pupils and staff.

Where a decision is taken to close the school day, parents will be informed in the usual way via Arbor.

Parents and carers will be expected to make arrangements for their children to be collected as soon as possible.

#### Reminder of school times of arrival

Gates open at 8:40am and close at 8:50am to ensure the safety of children and staff and the site is safe. Arrivals after this time need to enter the main gate on Vancouver Drive.

- Hours required to be worked: 7.50 hours per week



If attendance falls below 90% you are a persistent absentee and will be referred to the Educational Welfare Service in order to improve attendance.
