
TOWER VIEW NEWS

Partial Closures due to strike action

As has been communicated previously, one of the main teaching unions, the NEU, has further strike action on 1st March, 15th March and 16th March. If there are any changes to the partial closure, I will update parents by the end of this week.

The strikes are not only-or even mainly-about teacher pay but also about general school funding which has dropped significantly over the last 10 years. Any pay rises have had to be funded out of existing budgets meaning less money for the wider schools needs.

No teacher wants to strike or cause disruption.

Looking forward—we still have 1 INSET day to set for this school year—this will be on **FRIDAY 26th MAY** so on this day school will be closed to children.


School Dinners

We have been informed that school dinners should rise to £2.83 for those who pay for them after half term.

I feel that this is the wrong time to raise prices and this is not representing the value that school dinners should provide.

As a result, for the rest of this school year, school will subsidise the increase for all.

We will work with our meal providers about cost for the next school year but there may end up being a significant rise if food prices do not start to drop as the subsidy is not something we can provide long term.
